Born in West Africa, she was sold into slavery at the age of seven or eight and transported to North America. Educated and enslaved in the household of prominent Boston commercialist John Wheatley, lionized in New England and England, with presses in both places publishing her poems, and paraded before the new republic's political leadership and the old empire's aristocracy, Wheatley.

Phillis Wheatley - Poet | Academy of American Poets Phillis Wheatley was the first black poet in America to publish a book. She was born in 1753, in West Africa and brought to New England in 1761, where John Wheatley of Boston purchased her as a gift for his wife. Phillis Wheatley - Slave Poet of Colonial America Phillis Wheatley was born in Africa (probably Senegal) about 1753 or 1754. When she was about eight years old, she was kidnapped and brought to Boston. There, in 1761, John Wheatley bought her for his wife, Susanna, as a personal servant. As was the custom of the time, she was given the name Phillis. Phillis Wheatley | American poet | Britannica.com Phillis was escorted by the Wheatleys' son to London in May 1773. Her first book, Poems on Various Subjects, Religious and Moral, where many of her poems first saw print, was published there the same year. Wheatley's personal qualities, even more than her literary talent, contributed to her great social success in London.

Phillis Wheatley | National Women's History Museum Despite spending much of her life enslaved, Phillis Wheatley was the first African American and second woman (after Anne Bradstreet) to publish a book of poems. Born around 1753 in Gambia, Africa, Wheatley was captured by slave traders and brought to America in 1761. Phillis Wheatley Biography for Kids - MrNussbaum.com Phillis Wheatley was born in Gambia on May 8, 1753, and died in Boston on December 5, 1784. When she was 7 or 8, she was sold as a slave to John and Susanna Wheatley of Boston. She was named after the ship that brought her to America, The Phillis.
