Pragmatism: Definition and Philosophers Pragmatism is a philosophical school founded in the 19th century by philosophers and scientists who opposed the modern metaphysics (Hegel) and the dichotomy of theory / practice (Aristotle, Kant). The "founding fathers" are Peirce, James, Dewey, Mead (1850-1950) and "new pragmatists" are Rorty , Putnam, Quine, Goodman (1950-2000.
